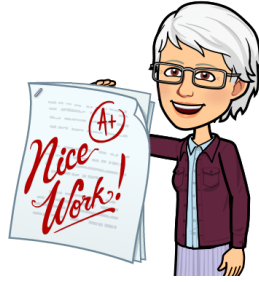


MRS. YAZVAC'S 6TH GRADE NEWSLETTER
